International Human Rights Day commemorates the adoption of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights (UDHR) by the United Nations General Assembly on December 10, 1948. 'Human rights refer to fundamental rights or freedoms, including people's right to live, health, education, freedom of speech and thoughts, and equal rights.

This day is observed to promote equality, peace, justice, freedom, and the protection of human dignity. Everyone is entitled to rights irrespective of race, color, religion, sex, language, or social status.

Objectives:

1. To empower the education fraternity, society, and professionals on equity and inclusion.
2. Reflecting on current challenges in achieving equity and inclusion
3. Empowering the society on human rights.
4. Providing an opportunity to global education and research community especially from remote areas to participate in an international event and proving knowledge on inclusion and equity.
